Hanako was born into a poor, rural family in 1903, but her father wanted her to receive a higher education and, at the age of ten, she was transferred to a Christian school for girls attended by children of noble birth or wealthy families. Unfortunately, Hanako could not understand what her English-speaking teachers were saying and she felt depressed for not being able to fit in. However, she overcame these challenges in bold and witty ways and eventually was able to excel at English surpass her schoolmates.
