Development Issue  Improvement in Environment and Disaster Risk Management	[Background and current situation] Mitigation measures at the community level for natural disasters, such as hurricanes, is essential to reduce damage in Grenada, a small island country, which has suffered damage caused by hurricanes many times. Regarding solid waste management, the government is promoting 3R (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle), but challenges remain to widen the participation of civil society and the private sector and also to ensure proper management and operation of final disposal sites.				[Strategy] The Government of Japan keeps in mind knowledge sharing and linkages with neighbouring countries and will assist this sector through training and follow-up. In particular, the Government of Japan aims to encourage participation of civil society and private companies in the 3R activities and improvement in operation and management of final disposal sites in the area of waste management. Furthermore, the Government of Japan aims to ensure the outcomes of the Caribbean Disaster Management Project Phase 2 are shared with all areas of Grenada for disaster prevention.
