50th Anniversary Events of Diplomatic Relations between Japan and Guyana ∼Japanese Film Festival and Ambassador Okada's Lecture at the University of Guyana∼

From 25th to 26th October 2017, the Embassy of Japan hosted the screening of a Japanese Film and a lecture was given by His Excellency Mitsuhiko Okada, Ambassador of Japan, at the University of Guyana as part of the Embassy of Japan's activities to celebrate the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Japan and the Cooperative Republic of Guyana in Guyana.
