Handing Over Ceremony for Organic Farms Project in Suriname

The Handing Over Ceremony for the Grant Assistance for the Grass-roots Human Security Project (GGP) entitled "The Project for the Construction of Organic Farms in Primary Schools" was held at 10:00 am on Tuesday 11 December 2018 at the Kampong Baroe School in Saramacca, Suriname.

The Suriname Waste Management Foundation (SUWAMA) received a grant totaling US\$ 87,890 from the Government of Japan for the construction of organic farms for 3 primary schools: De Hulp School in the district of Commewijne; Kampong Baroe School in the district of Saramacca; and Penny en Jon School in the district of Wanica. The introduction of these farms allows the children of Suriname the opportunity to learn hands-on lessons about the importance of self-sustainability and also promotes the benefits of healthy living. The farms will be used to display organic farming and aquaponics technologies to the students, who can use the acquired knowledge in their own homes, bringing about a gradual skills-transfer to the country's wider population.

Mr. Toshihide Kanaya, Second Secretary at the Embassy of Japan, who delivered remarks on behalf of the Government of Japan, commended SUWAMA for its invaluable work in fostering environmental conservation and promoting the responsible and sustainable management of energy, water, waste and biodiversity. Mrs. Djina Bergraaf – Sanchit, Chairwoman of SUWAMA, thanked the Embassy as well as the schools, teachers, students and other stakeholders who had contributed to the delivery of the project.
