Signing of Grant Contract for Pumping station Project in Grenada

The National Water and Sewerage Authority (NAWASA) of Grenada is set to receive US\$67,223 from the Government of Japan to construct a water pump station to improve water supply in Blaize and its surrounding communities.

The grant contract for this project, entitled “The Project for the Construction of Pumping Station” under the Japanese Government Grant Assistance for the Grass-roots Human Security Projects (GGP), was signed by Mr. Christopher Husbands, General Manager, on behalf of NAWASA on Tuesday 19 March 2019, while Tatsuo Hirayama, Ambassador of Japan to Grenada, signed on behalf of his Government. Through the grant, NAWASA will embark upon the construction of a station to pump water from the water reservoir located in the community of Upper St. John/Carrière up to the nearby village of Blaize, helping to ensure a constant supply of safe and potable water to the approximately 250 residents of Blaize and its surrounding communities.

The Government of Japan welcomes further opportunities to work with the Government and the People of Grenada, with a view to strengthening the bonds of friendship and mutual understanding between the two countries.
