## Japanese Government Funds Project for Improving Disaster Resilience and Emergency Shelter Management in Nevis Island

The signing ceremony for the Grant Assistance for the Grass-roots Human Security Projects (GGP) entitled "Project for Improving Disaster Resilience and Emergency Shelter Management in Nevis Island" took place at 10:15 a.m. on March 15, 2017 at the Emergency Operations Centre, Nevis Disaster Management Department, Long Point, Charlestown, Nevis. The Government of Japan awarded grant aid to Nevis Disaster Management Department to the value of US\$370,529 to assist in their project objectives, which focus on Disaster Risk Management across twelve communities on the Nevis island.


