<u>Handover Ceremony for the Project for Enhancing the Healthcare System through</u>

the Provision of Medical Equipment for Guyana

The handover ceremony for medical equipment procured under the Project for Enhancing the

Healthcare System through the Provision of Medical Equipment took place on April 5, 2022, in

Georgetown, Cooperative Republic of Guyana.

This multi-country project, which is valued at US\$ 4.6 million in total, is being implemented

under the management of the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS). As part of

this project, 4 Land Cruiser ambulances, 4 mobile x-ray machines, 5 autoclaves of 50 liters, 20

EGG recorders, 39 handheld pulse oximeters and 8 portable ultrasound scanning systems were

handed over to the Ministry of Health of Guyana to improve the capacity of Guyana's healthcare

system against the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Government of Japan was represented by Mr. KAMADA Yasuhiko, Counsellor, Embassy of

Japan, who was joined for the occasion by The Honourable Dr. Frank Anthony, Minister of Health

of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, Ms. Yesim Oruc, United Nations Resident Coordinator in

Guyana and Mr. Alejandro Rossi, Director of the UNOPS Multi-Country Office for the English &

Dutch Caribbean, Costa Rica and Panama.

The Government of Japan will continue to offer its support in areas such as disaster prevention,

environment, energy, waste management and fisheries in order to overcome the vulnerabilities

inherent to small island countries as well as to promote friendly relations and mutual understanding

with Caribbean countries.
