	[Background and Current Situation] As Grenada is a Small Island State, the damage from flooding and landslides caused by hurricanes is severe and affects the development of agriculture and tourism, which are the country's main industries. It is thus important to overcome this vulnerability to natural disasters, including Climate Change. In the area of solid waste management, the Government of Grenada is promoting the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle), however, there also exists concerns of increase in marine plastic waste. Increasing the ratio of renewable energy in the country's energy mix and promoting energy efficiency are also required given the country's reliance on imported fuel for energy production. Furthermore, There are also challenges in responding to the vulnerable healthcare sector that was made apparent by the spread of COVID-19 and other viruses. [Strategy for addressing development issues]  While utilizing facilities and equipment which were provided by previous Japanese fisheries grant aid, Japan will assist in industrial development and job creation, focusing on the sustainable development of the fisheries industry, taking into account the perspective of sustainable use of marine biological resources. Based on the Kunning-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) adopted at the end of 2022, Japan will contribute to biodiversity conservation or support initiatives that take biodiversity into consideration. During the implementation of projects, country's commitment in promoting the blue economy, as well as knowledge sharing and cooperation with neighbouring island countries facing similar challenges will be considered.
