Development Issue 1 Development of resilient social infrastructure	[Background and Currrent Situation] Although Guyana is a continental country it is a costal lowland country and is on the list of SIDS (Small Island Developing States) published by the UN Secretariat, along with the other CARICOM member countries. Taking Climate Change into account, disaster risk reduction measures have become an urgent need in Guyana due to the fact that the majority of the population lives in the coastal lowlands, which are particularly vulnerable to heavy rainfall and frequent flooding. Furthermore, although the country achieved high economic growth with the start of full-scale oil production in 2020, the maintenance of severely ageing electricity infrastructure, the transition to renewable energy and the promotion of energy efficiency is necessary. Moreover, urban environmental management, such as solid waste management (including the management of marine plastic waste) is required. With regard to the water sector, the main challenges are to improve the water treatment and sewage system, as well as to reduce the non- revenue water rate. Additionally, another challenge is to respond to the vulnerable healthcare sector that was made apparent by the spread of COVID-19 and other viruses.				er mitigation measures will be encouraged. In the environmental sector, cooperation that contributes to strengtheni capacity of the administrative sector while promoting the activities of the private sector, mainly in the fields such transition to renewable energy and energy efficiency, solid waste management, water resources management and healthcare, will be considered and implemented. As a result, these activities are expected to lead to overcoming vulnerabilities specific to small island developing states. Sharing expertise and experience and promoting synergy among neighbouring countries with similar problems will be taken into account while extending the development assistance.
