Completion Ceremony at the Academisch Ziekenhuis Paramaribo for the project "Improving Childhood Cancer Patients' Treatment System in Suriname"


A handover ceremony for the project titled "Improving Childhood Cancer Patients' Treatment System in Suriname" was held on Monday February 17, 2025, in Suriname.

The Project for Improving Childhood Cancer Patients' Treatment System in Suriname

The main objective of this project was to enhance the treatment and recovery of childhood cancer patients in Suriname. The creation of three (3) isolation rooms and one (1) treatment room for childhood cancer patients also ensures that children with serious illnesses receive sufficient and professional treatment for recovery while lowering the risk of spreading infectious diseases and making the cost of treatment more affordable. This project was implemented by the Academic Hospital Paramaribo with the support of the Lion's Club Paramaribo West.
