Ceremony for the Handover of Sargassum Removal Equipment Procured under Japan's Grant Aid

On Tuesday October 21, 2025, His Excellency Dr. Akima Umezawa, Ambassador of Japan, attended a handover ceremony for the project "Improving National Sargassum Management Capabilities in the Caribbean" at Shaw Park Complex, Scarborough, Tobago. Ambassador Umezawa officially handed over the keys to a tractor, which was one of the items procured under the grant aid project. This initiative is funded by the Government of Japan at a value of US\$ 12.3 million, with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) as the implementing agency.

In attendance at the event were the Honourable Farley Augustine, Chief Secretary of the Tobago House of Assembly; Mr. Ugo Blanco, Resident Representative, United Nations Development Programme in Trinidad and Tobago; Mr. Allan Stewart, Director, Tobago Emergency Management Agency, and Dr. Rahanna Juman, Deputy Director – Research, and Chair of the National Project Steering Committee and National Sargassum Task Force.
