Development Issue 1 Improvement in Disaster Risk Management and the Environment	[Background and current situation] As the Commonwealth of Dominica is a Small Island State, the damage from flooding and landslides, caused by hurricanes is severe and affects the development of agriculture and tourism, which are the country's main industries. It is an important challenge to overcome vulnerabilities to natural disasters, including Climate Change. In the area of waste management, the Government of the Commonwealth of Dominica is promoting 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle). Increasing the ratio of renewable energy in the country's energy mix and promoting energy efficiency are also required given the country's reliance on imported fuel for energy production.				[Strategy] The capacity of the Disaster Risk Management sector to cope with natural disasters, such as frequent hurricanes and flooding, will be strengthened, while utilising the dissemination of the outcomes of, and lessons learned from, past Japanese cooperation to other areas in the country.  To cope with Climate Change, both adaptation and mitigation measures will be encouraged through the ongoing program "Japan-Caribbean Climate Change Partnership".  With regard to waste management in the Environment sector, the participation of civil society and private companies in 3Rs will be promoted; an improvement in operation and management of final waste disposal sites will be targeted, and increasing the ratio of renewable energy in the country's energy mix and promoting energy efficiency will be supported. It is expected that these measures will lead to overcoming vulnerabilities particular to Small Island Developing States.
