To cope with Climate Change, both adaptation and mitigation measures will be encouraged through the ongoing program "Japan-Caribbean Climate Change Partnership." In the Environment sector, waste management (the promotion of the management of waste disposal and 3Rs), increasing the ratio of renewable energy in the country's energy mix and promoting energy efficiency will be supported. It is expected that these measures will lead to overcoming vulnerabilities particular to Small Island Developing States.
